INTRODUCTION:

The Wrentham Public School Council was formed after the passage of the Massachusetts Education Reform Act (MERA) in 1993, a law mandating that every public elementary, secondary, and independent vocational school in the Commonwealth establish a school council. The goal of the Education Reform Act was to ensure the meaningful involvement of parents and community members in the activities and governance of local elementary, secondary, and vocational schools throughout the Commonwealth.

School councils are advisory bodies. School councils shall provide advice and recommendations to the school principals and where appropriate to the school committee. School councils shall provide assistance and represent the community of parents and businesses and shall be reflective of the school community.

Its purpose is to assist the principal in identifying goals for the school and identifying students' educational needs. With input from various committees/cadres made up of staff and parents, the Council is also responsible for reviewing and monitoring the building budget, monitoring the current School Improvement Plan (SIP), and preparing a School Improvement Plan (SIP) for the next school year.

During the 2016-2017 a comprehensive School Needs Survey was administered to both the families and staff associated with the Delaney and Roderick Schools. The survey results along with other data sources such as MCAS were used as baseline data to inform the creation of the next School Improvement Plan for the 2017-2019 school years.

Glossary of Terms and Abbreviations

Leadership Team - The Wrentham Public Schools Leadership Team consists of the following administrators: Superintendent, Principals, Business Manager, Director of Curriculum, Instruction, and Assessment, Director of Student Services, and the Director of Technology.

SIP - School Improvement Plan

Walker Report - An Independent Special Education Review funded by the King Philip, Norfolk, Plainville, and Wrentham school districts to review and improve the special education provisions in Wrentham, Norfolk, Plainville, and the KP school districts.

W.E.S.T. - Wrentham Elementary Schools Trust- W.E.S.T. has generously funded many programs and events over the years through additional fundraising efforts to enrich the learning opportunities provided to the students attending Delaney and Roderick Schools.

WPS - Wrentham Public Schools
